There is a large statue of a mouse in front of the store and the specialty of the house is “squeaky cheese” a mild Colby type cheese that at the right temperature and age literally squeaks when you chew it. It is a smell and memory that I associate with my childhood. It is a part of “home.” After a stop at Wilson’s, we continued north and after reaching Alpena, we stopped at a store and bought a gallon of pickled ring bologna. Once again a staple of the pantry “up north”. We then arrived at Dorothy (Diane’s sister) and Al’s cottage and things were now complete: squeaky cheese, pickled bologna and family.

Another important part of our visit was that I was honored to baptize a great niece and a great nephew. We celebrated the first baptism on my mother-in-laws coffee table using a large bowl that she made years ago as the font. The second baptism was celebrated in an inland lake “up north using the lake as the font. While I followed the baptismal formula, I must admit that I improvised the service to reflect the reality of each situation. There was a certain honesty to both baptisms unencumbered by page numbers. I thought about both of those baptisms during the following days. I thought about the words of baptism and the sound and the touch of the water. I thought about the earliest days of the church and the joy of family both in our secular lives and that much larger family of those redeemed and washed by the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Those thoughts were really memories of the faith that each and every Christian carries. They are memories (traditions) that have been preserved and nurtured by those of the faithful that have gone before and now belong to us that we too might preserve the faith for future generations.
