I AM AN ANGLICAN

For those who are keeping up with the political life of the Episcopal Church, the headline above might seem like a radical statement. Are not Anglicans those who have chosen to walk a different ecclesiastical path than the Episcopal Church? Many parishes that have "left" the Episcopal Church now use the word "Anglican" as a way of identifying themselves. By identifying themselves as Anglicans they speak to the world that they are no longer under the authority of the General Convention of the Episcopal Church, the Presiding Bishop or the diocesan bishop of the Episcopal diocese in which they live. While it saddens me that many have left our communion and that they have every right to use any word to identify themselves, I am not willing to give up such a foundational word as "Anglican" to speak of our own identity. I have heard well meaning people say, "I am an Episcopalian, not an Anglican," Well, yes we are, and let's see what that means.

I quote from The Oxford Dictionary of the Christian Church: "Anglicanism" *The word properly applies to the system of doctrine and practice upheld by those Christians who are in religious communion with the see of Canterbury. But it is especially used, in a somewhat more restricted sense, of that system in so far as it emphasizes its claim to possess a religious outlook distinguishable from that of other Christian communions both Catholic and Protestant.*

Anglicanism arose out of conflict. It rejected the presumptive claim of supremacy made by the Bishop of Rome and rejected the radical extremism of the Continental Reformation. Its roots are deeply grounded in Holy Scripture, the ancient creeds of the early church and a unique view of the gift of reason as a gift from God that is lived out in the community of the Church. All of this is finally wrapped up in the agreement to continue faithfully in communion with the Archbishop of Canterbury and the wholeness of the Anglican Communion around the world. This is easier said than done. Holding together a worldwide communion that finds itself in so many cultures and socio-political realities without a central authority that dictates compliance is a difficult task. We struggle to find the Christ in affluence and poverty, sophistication and the mundane, liberal and conservative, and mores that differ from anyone's personal experience. We are struggling with that in profound ways today, not only in the Episcopal Church but throughout the Communion. The easy response to such struggle is to go one's own way, to say I am an Anglican but not an Episcopalian, or I am an Anglican but a Reformed Anglican, or I am an Anglican in the United States but am within the jurisdiction of an African Archbishop, or I am an Anglican but independent and the list goes on.

I heard it said recently that "Anglicanism only works face to face." I understand that to mean that unless we are willing to engage the "opposition" in personal relationship our beliefs and practices are as dry as the bones of Ezekiel's prophecy. We must also be very careful never to claim a superiority of truth over those with whom we disagree. Always remember that there is a living, breathing, feeling child of God who is the object of our possibly mistaken righteousness.

I am an Anglican and you, my Episcopalian brothers and sisters are Anglicans, too. We were born as such out of conflict and we continue to live within that conflict. It is as we engage with one another and seek the truth in the other that God is to be found.

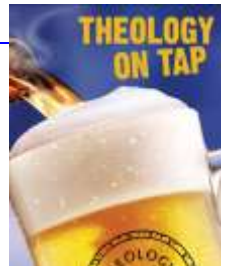


Taking Time to Smell the Roses
