SAVE OUR ORGAN CAMPAIGN STARTS NOW

From Dean Hurley

The beautiful music from our 1932 Austin pipe organ will soon be just a memory unless we take action now.



An organ inspection turned up serious problems with the console and the out-dated wiring. The price tag to replace this organ with one of similar quality would be more than one million dollars. We cannot afford this but there is an alternative. Our appraisers have said we can rebuild and improve the organ for about \$200,000. This would give us another 40 to 45 years of service.

In the next few days you should receive a letter and a pledge card asking for your help. We need this desperately. If you do not receive a letter, cards will be available in Gardner Hall and other locations or you can call Stacy at 342-7010, ext. 100.

The organ is the heart of our music program. It has served us for 78 years and it can still continue if we replace and rebuild several key areas. It must have taken a lot of faith in the middle of the Great Depression in 1932 to buy this organ. It was not a low bid process but it was a quality process. It was also the right thing to do. With just one major repair in 1989 during the termite crisis, the organ played on. With this rebuild we can include a Festival Stop that will allow rolling sound to fill the sanctuary.

With your help, we can secure the heart of our music for another half century.

“TO SHOW PEOPLE JESUS”

The title of this article is the mission statement of Canterbury Cathedral. Many mission statements are the result of weekend retreats, committee work and full of flowery and religious language unknown by those the “mission” is attempting to reach. How the mission statement of Canterbury Cathedral was developed, I do not know. Perhaps they had such retreats and committee work and finally someone said, “Wait a minute. What is our real mission? Is it not to show people Jesus?” That should be our mission at Trinity Cathedral as well.

There are many ways to do that. The most obvious (and the most important) is the regular schedule of worship that the Cathedral offers. We gather Sunday after Sunday in Eucharist together. We listen to Scripture read and sermons preached. 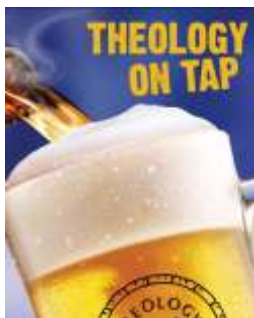
